National Training Program (NTP)

What is the National Training Program?

✓ A component of the endMS Research and Training Network


 \checkmark \$2009-2015 →\$2015-2018 → \$2019 → \$2019-2022

What are the program goals?

- To enhance knowledge and skills relevant to MS research;
- ➤ To increase/sustain intent to pursue MS research; and,
- ➤ To foster opportunities to conduct MS research in Canada.



What are the Training components of the NTP?



Annual endMS Summer School

- Started in 2009: Montreal (2x); Halifax (2x); Calgary (2x); Winnipeg; Vancouver (3x), St. John's, Toronto, Saskatchewan (2021) and Ottawa (2022).
- Application deadline **February 26th**, **2021. 40 participants**

2. endMS SPRINT (Scholar Program for Researchers IN Training)

- Program implemented annually since 2011; 83 trainees have completed the program, 8 currently enrolled.
- Application deadline February 24th, 2021. 9 participants

Annual endMS Summer School



- ➤ A 3 day interactive education program with ~40 trainees from across Canada
 - ➤ Small group sessions designed to facilitate networking, collaboration and information exchange among trainees from various disciplines
 - ➤ One central MS-related topic is selected as the theme; alternating between basic science and clinical and population health

2011 – Calgary: Neuroprotection & Repair

2012 – Winnipeg: Gaining Insights from Special Populations and other Complex Diseases

2014 – Halifax: Translational MS Research: From Ideas to Innovation to Implementation

2015 – Montreal: The Biology of Attack and Repair in MS

2017 - St-John's: Moving MS Research Forward through Clinical and Biomedical Partnerships

2018 - Toronto: Environmental and Lifestyle Factors Associated with MS: Bench to Bedside



Application procedure: The MS Society of Canada uses a web-based apply online process for the submission of applications. https://proposalcentral.com

Applicants **MUST** review the Summer School Online Application Guidelines for complete instructions.

Application Requirements:

- ✓ Your Contact Information
- ✓ One Reference
 - ✓ your current Supervisor (if none currently, a faculty member who is familiar with your work within the last 2 years)
- ✓ Education and Training Summary (see guidelines for requirements)
- ✓ Current Training in Progress
- ✓ Signature page (template provided)



Summer School Important Dates & Selection Process

endMS Summer School Application Deadline: February 26, 2021 at 4:00 pm EST

SELECTION PROCESS

Applications are vetted first for eligibility and completeness.

Reviewed by the endMS Summer School Review Committee and selected based on:

- ✓ the perceived added value of the program to the applicant over and above their current training program
- ✓ education and research experience
- ✓ reference letter
- ✓interest in MS research and career goals
- ✓ applicants who have already attended 2 or more Summer Schools may receive a lower priority
- ✓ applicants who were accepted to the 2020 Summer School may receive a higher priority

Anticipated Notice of the results for Summer School: Mid April 2021 2021 endMS Summer School Dates: June 7-9, 2021





Eligibility (Summer School)

To be eligible, applicants must be in one of the following situations:

- Enrolled in a graduate program at a Canadian university*
- ➤ Hold a postdoctoral/clinical fellowship at a Canadian university*
 (must have completed their PhD within the last 4 years at the time of the application)
- Completed graduate training and currently enrolled in an undergraduate program (e.g. M.D. program) at a Canadian university*
- * for Summer School only: applicants who are enrolled in a university outside of Canada AND funded by the MS Society of Canada are eligible.





sprint



Learning Objectives

To be able to:

- ✓ Identify strategies to enhance your career success
- ✓ Identify possible future collaborators
- Complete an interdisciplinary learning project

SPRINT interdisciplinary learning project objectives are to:

- ✓ Synthesize and integrate ideas from different disciplines
- ✓ Collaborate with peers from different disciplines
- ✓ Interpret interdisciplinary literature
- ✓ Respond to interdisciplinary critiques of their work
- ✓ Present the results of an interdisciplinary learning project, at the endMS Summer School

Project outcomes include:

- 14 Peer reviewed publications;
- Interactive tools for people living with MS;
- Information pamphlets and presentations for the lay public;
- Conference presentations
- Post-program presentations, publications, grant funding, etc.









Benefits of



- ✓ Participation in two consecutive Summer Schools (2021 and 2022)
- ✓ An endMS SPRINT stipend of \$2,500
- ✓ Travel funds to participate in a SPRINT team meeting (if and when possible) usually at the mentor's institution
- ➤ EndNote and Systematic Review management software access
- >A unique experience, particularly during a pandemic

Program duration: 13 months (June 2021 to June 2022)

Estimated minimum time commitment: 2 weeks (Summer School) plus ~8 hours/month (between the 2021 and 2022 endMS Summer Schools)



Logistics of sprint



Based on the information provided in the application and the interdisciplinary projects proposed for the year:

- > Teams of 3 or 4 trainees are partnered with a SPRINT mentor by the SPRINT Committee.
 - partnering applicants and mentors from different backgrounds/locations.
- The SPRINT mentors develop and guide the interdisciplinary SPRINT project.
- The teams will work on the project with their SPRINT mentor during the period between the two consecutive endMS Summer Schools.
 - The teams hold regular meetings and two face to face meetings (if able).
- >SPRINTers should expect to invest approximately 8 hours of work/month in the project.

SELECTION PROCESS FOR SPRINT

Applications will be vetted for completeness and eligibility.

Reviewed by the **endMS SPRINT Peer Review Committee** and selected based on:

- ✓ the perceived added value of the program to the applicant over and above their current training program
- ✓ reference letter
- ✓ education and research experience
- ✓ publications
- √ transcripts
- ✓interest in MS research and career goals

Anticipated notice of the SPRINT results: April 2021 2021-2022 endMS SPRINT start date: June 2021





Eligibility Sprint

To be eligible, applicants must be in one of the following situations:

- ➤ Enrolled in a graduate program at a Canadian university*
- ➤ Hold a postdoctoral/clinical fellowship at a Canadian university*

 (must have completed their PhD within the last 4 years at the time of the application)
- Completed graduate training and currently enrolled in an undergraduate program (e.g. M.D. program) at a Canadian university*

Applicants who are accepted into SPRINT must anticipate being enrolled in a program with full time status for the full duration of their participation in SPRINT (June 2021 to June 2022).

*applicants who are enrolled in a university outside of Canada are <u>not</u> eligible for the SPRINT program.





Application Tips!

Do:

- ✓ Read both the application and program guidelines first
- **✓** Sign up for an Orchid identifier
- ✓ Start your Common CV ASAP
- ✓ Notify Your Referee provide a description of the program
- ✓ Re-Notify/Follow up with your referee It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that the letter of recommendation has been submitted prior to the deadline
- ✓ Review application before submitting
- ✓ Contact us with any questions regarding the program
- ✓ Contact <u>pcsupport@altum.com</u> with any questions regarding the application submission process
- ✓ Apply to both Summer School and SPRINT SPRINT applicants who are not accepted are NOT automatically considered for Summer School. Applicants are encouraged to apply to both SPRINT and Summer School.


